

Over 1,000 artworxLA students were served in 29 alternative education sites throughout Los Angeles County

OUR STUDENTS SUCCEED

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Over 1,000 artworxLA students from 29 school sites produced and presented new artwork with professional teaching artists in multidisciplinary, thematic workshops with our Level 1 cultural partners:

Los Angeles Public Library Into the Unknown: Sci-Fi Visions of the Future

Japanese American National Museum Monuments and Memory: Reconstructing American History

Autry Museum of the American West Voices of a Movement: LA RAZA and Community Journalism

13 students at the artworxLA Academy at the LA Education Corps – Pico Union branch graduated from high school!

Advanced Programs students attended competitive summer programs at Otis' Summer of Art, UCLA's Teen ArchStudio Summer Institute, Idyllwild Arts, Cal Arts' CAPSA Program, Art Center at Night, Art Center Teens and Ryman Arts.



PAVING CAREER **PATHWAYS**

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79 Advanced Program students prepare for the workforce in a year-long Leadership Development program where they develop their character traits, write personal statements, and build resumes.

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Advancing students up the "ladder," this year's Fashion residency was re-designed to focus on Illustration, allowing 10 students to build portfolios for summer scholarship applications.

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Visual Arts students took their sketching workshop to Arlington Gardens, where they made observational drawings that showed their artistic and technical progress on their way to creative careers.

Teens visit Coagula Curatorial's exhibition space in Chinatown and get an inside look at the process from Visual Artist and Curator Leigh Salgado.

4 students receive paid internships through Evolve Entertainment, Bixel Exchange and Youth Source to work in the creative industries at Native Content, Snap Design Academy, Angel City Lumber, and Film Independent.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

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artworxLA Level 1 students display their amazing work in nine public presentations at the landmark cultural partner sites: Autry Museum of the American West, Japanese American National Museum, and L.A. Public Library.

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The Fashion and Visual Arts residencies culminate in the spring with special presentations of students' projects at MOCA's Family Day.



Led by teaching artist and previous Getty intern, Brenzy Solorzano, students participate in a summer zine-making workshop and exhibit thier work as a part of LA Freewave's Gender Promenade, Ain't I a Womxn? in Los Angeles State Historic Park.

As part of the LA's Department of Cultural Affairs' "The Big Read," students created paintings with Teaching Artist, Vincent Ramos, inspired by the book "Citizen."

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In partnership with Union Bank and Councilmember Curren D. Price, City of LA 9th District, artworxLA has 4 student apprentices assist artist Kristy Sandoval paint a public mural for the South LA Community.

IN THE MEDIA

RECOGNIZED NATIONALLY

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In connection with the development of **artworx**LA's Creative Careers Pathway Model, the Irvine Foundation awarded **artworx**LA an esteemed research and development grant focused on improving efforts to prepare and place high-risk young people (ages 14-24) in jobs in the creative economy. Our field scan has revealed existing resources for support in workforce development, social service agencies and industry leaders and is the impetus for the launch of artworxLA's interactive website ELEVATE. 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In its second year, the **artworx**LA paid Internship expands to offer hands-on learning opportunities to 24 students, with Fall and Spring semester engagement

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Three continuation schools are added to the artworxLA network, bringing our total to 29 schools in seven districts across L.A. County.

artworxLA brings arts education to seven juvenile justice facilities through membership in the Arts for Incarcerated Youth network.
